Elon Musk's recent announcement of wanting to establish an "America Party" is just the latest twist in the mission of tech billionaires to dominate the political sphere and undermine democracy. With their control over key digital technologies, companies like Amazon, Google, and Microsoft have already gained enormous influence over our social and economic systems, reinforcing neoliberalism worldwide: through the precarization of work, the destruction of the environment and nature, the gentrification and overtouristification of cities, and the direct and indirect support of the extreme right, not to mention the increasing surveillance of users globally.

This development is evident in many places: in Berlin, the Amazon Tower in Friedrichshain, the Tesla factory in Grünheide, and the Google headquarters in Kreuzberg, which was only averted thanks to strong mobilization. In Hesse and North Rhine-Westphalia, too, opposition to hyperscale data centres is growing louder. And from Spain, Taiwan and Uruguay to the indigenous Sapmí, protests are mounting against large-scale projects that are being pushed forward under the guise of 'green' development against the will of the local population.

It is becoming increasingly clear to a wider public that these political promises of growth and "regional development" only benefit the outlandish tech utopias of Musk, Zuckerberg, Bezos, and others. On the left, resistance is also growing, along with a debate about how the power grab of digital monopoly capitalism has changed the conditions for emancipatory struggles.

With the planned Anti-Big-Tech Conference, we aim to connect local struggles against Big Tech and discuss strategies on how to collectively resist the rising tech fascism. Most importantly, it is intended to facilitate better networking and coordination among the many local struggles against large tech corporations that are already taking place, thereby increasing their political impact. Through lectures, workshops, panels, discussion rounds, and plenty of opportunities for exchange, we want to inform, educate, and connect. The conference will conclude with a party.

We are a coalition of groups that share practices of resistance against Big Tech's exploitation of workers (Tech Workers Coalition), urban spaces (Berlin vs. Amazon, NoGoogleCampus), and ecological resources (Tesla den Hahn abdrehen). We are currently reaching out to other initiatives from the anti-capitalist, anti-fascist, and queer-feminist spectrum in Berlin for collaboration.

For the organizing team we are currently looking for motivated comrades! No prior knowledge is required, just motivation and about 10 hours per month for meetings (preferably in person) and organizational work from September 2025 to April 2026.

We plan to work in working groups focusing on financing, internal infrastructure, logistics, conference care work, awareness, the conference program, public relations/social media, and creative actions. Anyone critically engaging with Big Tech in the academic field is also warmly invited.

We want to be outwardly combative but internally respectful and valuing. We thus have no room for any form of discrimination, violence, or boundary violations either at the conference or in the organizing team. Hurtful and boundary-crossing behavior, such as sexist, racist, anti-Semitic, queerphobic, ableist, classist, or similar offenses, will not be tolerated.

The **Anti-Big-Tech Conference** is to take place in **March 2026**. The preparation phase will kick off with a meeting on **September 14, 2025, at 3 PM**.
